2. A. Stations of unit from 16 July, 1942 to 31 August, 1942:
 New York City, 16 July, 1942 — Departed this station on board
 H. M. S. Pantour for unknown destination. Arrived Fort Tausig, Egypt,
 on 16 August 1942. Departed Fort Tausig, Egypt, by train 18 August
 1942, arrived Haifa, Palestine 19 August 1942 and Beit Daras,
 Palestine that evening. Advance party left Beit Daras by air for
 Mariut, Egypt for training on 27 August, 1942 and arrived Mariut
 that date.
- B. Stations of unit from 1 September, 1942 to 30 September, 1942, giving
 marches necessary to complete changes of stations:
 Mariut, Egypt, 2 September, 1942 — advance party departed this
 station by motor transport for L. G. 97, travelled 40 miles, and arrived
 at L. G. 97, Egypt, that date. Departed this station by motor transport
 for Mariut, Egypt on 7 September, travelled 40 miles, and arrived Mariut

that date. Advance party departed this station by motor transport for L. G. 174 and 16 September 1942, travelled 35 miles, and arrived L. G. 174, Western Desert, Egypt, that date.

Remainder of the Squadron left Beit Daras, Palestine by train on 13 September, 1942 and arrived at Transit Camp, Ariya, Egypt 15 September. 17 September, left Transit Camp, Ariya, travelled 23 miles, and arrived at L. G. 174, Western Desert, Egypt, that date.

C. Stations of halt from 1 October to 31 October, 1942, giving marches necessary to complete changes of station:

L. G. 174, Western Desert, Egypt, 1 October, 1942 -- Departed this station by motor transport for L. G. 91, Western Desert, Egypt on 6 October 1942, travelled 3 miles, and arrived at L. G. 91 that date.

D. Stations of halt from 1 November to 30 November, 1942, giving marches necessary to complete changes of station:

L. G. 91, Western Desert, Egypt, 1 November, 1942 -- Departed this station by motor transport for L. G. 106, Western Desert, Egypt on 5 November, 1942, travelled 83 miles that date and camped near L. G. 106 that night. 6 November, 1942, marched to L. G. 106, travelled 5 miles, and arrived at L. G. 106 that date. L. G. 106 from 6 November to 9 November, 1942. Departed this station by motor transport for L. G. 101 on 9 November, 1942, travelled 79 miles that date, and arrived that night at L. G. 101, Western Desert, Egypt. Departed this station by motor transport for L. G. 76 on 11 November, 1942, travelled 105 miles, and arrived at

L. C. 76, Western Desert, Egypt, that date. Left L. C. 76 for L. C. 142 on 12 November, 1942, and travelled 90 miles that date. 13 November, 1942, enroute to L. C. 142, travelled by motor transport 55 miles, and arrived at L. C. 142, Gumbut, Libya, that date. Left L. C. 142, Gumbut, for L. C. 150, Ain el Gasala, Libya on 15 November, 1942, travelled 60 miles by motor transport, and arrived at Gasala, L. C. 83 that date. Left Gasala on 17 November, 1942, and travelled 50 miles that date. 20 November, 1942, enroute to Bartuba, Libya, travelled 53 miles, and arrived at Bartuba, L. C. 83, that date. Bartuba, Libya, from 20 November, 1942 to November 29, 1942. Left Bartuba, L. C. 83, on 29 November, 1942, travelled 95 miles that date. 30 November, 1942, enroute to Bahariyah, Libya, travelled 100 miles that date.
